## CONSTRUCTION I

The neighbourhood's look will be transformed in the future with several projects.

### Cité Collégiale Expansion

The French-language college invited residents to a consultation on April 28. About 20 area residents attended the meeting.

The college is planning a new building focussing on training emergency services professionals. This new building would be attached to the existing structure and be located at the junction of La Cité Private and Des Pionniers.

The soccer field and the wooded areas on both side of La Cité Private will remain.

## INTERPROVINCIAL BRIDGE UPDATE

In addition to the consultant's recommendation to assess in detail the Kettle Island crossing, the corridors at Lower Duck Island/Lorrain Boulevard, and Lower Duck Island/Gatineau Airport/McLaurin Bay will be included in Phase 2 of the Interprovincial Bridge study.

While this is a victory for us and neighbours in Manor and Rockcliffe Parks, Fairhaven and Vanier, Kettle Island is far from dead. There are parties that want the Kettle Island crossing because it would keep traffic out of their part of town.

We agree that truck routes and residential neighbourhoods do not mix and that there is a route east of Canotek industrial park and west of the Greenbelt that would be far enough away from residences to offer a satisfactory solution for all.

Your association continues to work with other community association and politicians to ensure that there will not be a bridge at Kettle Island.



## EMERALD ASH BORER

The Emerald ash borer is a serious insect pest that attacks and kills all species of ash trees. Roughly one out of every four trees in the city are ash trees. All are expected to die in 10 to 15 years. The insect is present and has infected trees in our neighbourhood.

The City has a tree replacement program that could help you. The City has also asked to attend our next Annual General Meeting to discuss this issue.

## NEIGHBORHOOD SECURITY

In the area north of the Cité collégiale, a Neighbourhood Watch Program was implemented in 2007. We are proposing to do the same for the area south of Cité collégiale.

In order for us to have accurate data and to justify our efforts (and yours as volunteers) it is important that you report any incidents of crime. From as small as graffiti and vandalism to any form of violence including threats, all need to be reported to give us a profile of crime in our community.

The current school on Sladen St. no longer met the needs of the students and teachers. The new school will boast an additional soccer field, an environmental garden and a new play structure. All of these will be available for the community to use after school hours.

### 800 Montreal Rd.

Consultation took place April 7 and was well attended by our residents.

Three options were presented for the redevelopment of this property (pictured on left) including "green concepts". In summary, this area will include low-rise, medium-rise buildings, a park and possibly a retirement residence.
